Andersen Air Force Base coordinator Captain McVay received a total of nine fishing nets which were purchased with \$800 donation from RC Ryugasaki Chuo, RC Mito and RC Ryugasaki Chuo District Governor. The fishing nets were distributed among boxes dropped over the different atoll islands in Micronesia.

RCOGS also coordinated vision screenings with Seventh Day Adventist during his layover in Guam and three achromatopsia cases were identified by Dr. McClenathan.
